STAR- how can we connect

In lessons and assemblies we ask our students to STAR. This is both about our students being ready to learn and enjoy their right to an education as well as encouraging connection and belonging in the classroom.


S - Sit up *to look interested and stay engaged -* we want students to focus on what is being taught, part of this is tracking what is being said. If students are alert

and listening to what is being said it helps them enjoy their right to an education, develop a deeper understanding and ultimately perform better.

T -Track the speaker to show other people their ideas matter - we want students to engage with all who are speaking, this may

be the class teacher, or one of their peers answer the question, we want students to look at those talking, to build the connection in the classroom.

A - Appreciate your classmates ideas nod and smile when your classmates speak - we want students to listen to what is being said by all and encourage



them to answer questions, this helps build that connection, an encouraging smile or a nod can help build the connection in the room. It is also a good way to interact in corridors too.

R- Respect everyone's right to an education *listen follow instructions first time and focus on your work.* - all students have the right to an education, to enjoy this right all students need to ensure that they are in school, following instructions of what they need to do and focusing on their work. They should also make sure that they reach out for help when needed.

Safety - arriving and departing from school

We would like to thank you in advance for your continued support in ensuring that our school site remains safe as the students arrive and depart Kingsdown School. We have seen a notable increase in the number of cars dropping students off in the mornings and collecting them at the end of the school day. This does impact on the safety of our students and we are looking at alternatives to ensure that we all work together to ensure their safety. If you drop off/collect your child please remember the following:

- There is a drop off/collect area at the sports centre car park
- Cars are only permitted on site to collect students if you have a parking permit. To be eligible for a parking permit you must fit the following criteria:
 - Your child has a blue badge for disability
 - Your child is part of the ASC centre
 - Your child has a recent injury e.g. broken leg, that requires them to be dropped off as close to school as possible
 - o Other agreed circumstances authorised by the Designated Safeguarding Lead
- The speed limit for the site is 5mph
- Do not park on the hatched areas
- Do not double park

GLA Testing and Target setting

Please be aware that we are carrying out Reading Age assessments on Monday 23rd September and Tuesday 24th September for all students in Years 7 to 10. It is important we know your child's reading age so that we can put in reading intervention where it is needed and so that our teachers are able

to plan lessons effectively. Can you support us with this by ensuring your child's chromebooks are fully charged and they bring with them their earphones.
